CIVILISATION

L'Australie est le 6^e plus grand pays du monde avec 7,6 millions de km². Sa population en revanche n'est que de 23 millions, ce qui en fait un des pays à la plus faible densité (environ 3 habitants/km²).

C'est un pays de contrastes naturels avec un centre désertique, un nord tropical, un sud-est tempéré et des zones de prairies et de savane.
